"We are feeling a sense of shock and we are deeply concerned about the welfare of the pedestrian struck by our vehicle yesterday morning. We offer her our best wishes and whatever support we can provide to her and her family, we will.

"We are also concerned for the welfare of our driver, who is understandably devastated about the accident and very worried about the outcome of the accident for the pedestrian. We are providing the driver with ongoing psychological support and assistance.

"We are currently working with the police to determine the cause of the accident. We don't yet know all of the facts surrounding the accident, and until such time as we do, we are unable to provide any further comment."
